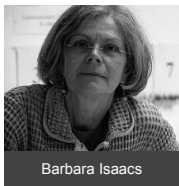

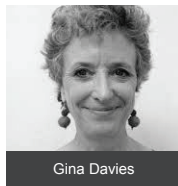
ENABLE 2015 is a visionary conference designed to bring together leading experts to provide actionable insights for early years professionals.

The conference aims to introduce various pedagogical approaches, highlighting the valuable work being undertaken across the sector.

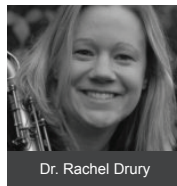

THURSDAY 5TH NOVEMBER 2015

Renowned Montessorian **Barbara Isaacs** will discuss encouraging children's independence through fostering initiative and supporting challenge and **Monika Jephcott**, the head of Play Therapy UK, will explain the workings of play therapy through the exploration of prevention and healing in the lives of children.

Leslee Udwin, director of acclaimed film East is East and galvanizing documentary India's Daughter, will present her vision for a new Equality Studies Global Initiative in partnership with the UNHRC which will roll out with a compulsory curriculum for the early years.

Experienced speech and language therapist **Gina Davies** will examine how best to engage learners with autistic spectrum disorder and **Dr. Rachel Drury**, Creative and Contextual Studies Lecturer at the Royal Conservatoire of Scotland, will explore

the non-musical impact of music with specific regard to health, wellbeing and development. The Feuerstein Institute's **Rabbi Rafi Feuerstein** will lecture on the modifiability of intelligence and delegates will be advised on the power of integrated practice in safeguarding children by **Dame Donna Kinnair**.

Martin Pace, Director of Reflections Nursery, will introduce participants to the setting's approach to forest school and risk in children's play, drawing inspiration from Reggio Emilia and Danish pre-schools.

Dr. Gavin Reid will provide delegates with strategies to support young children with dyslexia in the early years and **Michael Rosen**, author and poet, will talk to conference participants about fostering curiosity in the lives of young learners.
